

## **Recommended Summer Reading for Students Entering First Grade**

Number of Books: 10 to 25

**Assessment:** Record reading data on the Berean Academy Reading Log (due the first day of school). Students who complete all the recommended summer reading requirements will receive a test grade of 100 to start the fall semester, and they will also receive vouchers for five assigned dress-down days.

**Non-Fiction:** It is highly recommended that at least five titles be non-fiction. The current reading list does not include non-fiction titles, so parents will need to choose age appropriate non-fiction selections for their children.

**Read Alouds:** An adult may read aloud up to five of titles to the child, as long as the selections are at least third-grade level.

**Selections:** The second and third pages of this document contain a list of recommended books for this age group; however, parents and students are not limited to this list. To locate additional titles, visit <a href="https://www.arbookfind.com/">https://www.arbookfind.com/</a> and click the "Quiz Search" link. Enter a title or author in the search box to find the level of the book. The level represents a rough correlation to school grade equivalence (ex. 0.7 means Kindergarten 7th month or March; 1.0 means beginning First Grade). Students entering first grade should read books at the 0.7 level or higher. Parents may help students with difficult words.
